Dear Residents:

Recently I was reflecting on our country's first president, George Washington. His life history is incredible, especially his desire for freedom. Many may not realize he served in the British Military. How difficult would it have been to then be the general who led the Continental Army against the most powerful military force in the world? Historians agree that if he had wanted to run for a third term in office, he would have easily been successful in gaining the votes of the American people. 2024 Construction Projects

Utility construction projects in Centerville will begin soon. Like years past, the City is partnering with other utility companies that want to improve their infrastructure in the road and rights of way. Each entity has secured contractors to complete their projects. The City anticipates all construction will be completed by the fall of 2024.

Peach Tree Dr. from Main Street to Cherry Lane & 50 East north of Peach Tree Dr.

Weber basin will be replacing their main irrigation line and service lines to each property. The City will be replacing their main water line and service lines to each property. Trees in the park strip will be removed, selected sidewalk, curb and gutter and ADA ramps will be updated, then the road will be resurfaced.

Briarwood Dr. from 100 East to 400 East.

Deuel Creek Irrigation will be replacing their main line and service lines to each property. The City will be replacing their main line and service lines to each property. Selected curb and gutter and ADA ramps will be updated, then the road will be resurfaced.

Driveway Approach Information

If you want to replace or expand your drive approach, you need to fill out an approach permit with the Public Works Department. All work done on the approach must meet City standards and be approved before work begins.

Park Strip Tree Planting

All trees planted in the park strip require a [tree planting application](#). All tree types must be approved by the City before planting. Exceptions are made on a case by case basis.



Park Strip Tree Information

Spring is a great time to prune your trees located in the park strip!



All vegetation and landscaping material must not exceed two feet in height.



Enclosed mailboxes must meet USPS standards of a height of 41-45 inches and not exceed 18 inches by 18 inches measured at the base.



Bark, mulch, or wood chips of any size is prohibited in park strips.



Asphalt or cement within the park-strip may be allowed by special permission by the Public Works Department. Brick (not cemented in) rock pavers and flat stones are permitted.



Trees must be planted 20 feet from another park-strip tree and 30 feet from a public safety sign.



All trees planted within a park-strip require a permit to be reviewed and approved by the Public Works Department. Only park-strips four feet wide or greater are allowed to have trees planted in them.

Cemetery Cleanup

Spring cleanup of all grave decorations is the first week of April. Cemetery visitors are asked to please help our maintenance staff by collecting all grave decorations that will impede grounds care. Mowing season is from April 1 – Nov. 1. Here are three decoration rules to remember:

- Temporary decorations may be placed inside the six-inch mow strips on markers at any time during the mowing season.
- No decorations permitted outside the six-inch mow strip of markers including anything stuck in or placed on the grass.
- Decorations on flat markers & older markers without mow strips will be mowed around one time. At the time of the next mowing, decorations will be discarded with the exception of the week following Memorial Day.

Memorial Day cleanup begins the Monday following Memorial Day when all decorations that have not been retrieved will be discarded. Depending on the amount of decorations left to be cleaned up, it usually takes two to five days to complete. Thank you for your help keeping our cemetery beautiful.
