Mayor's Message



Dear Residents:

Fall Clean Up

Centerville City is offering a fall cleanup service provided by Ace Disposal for residents to dispose of household garbage and yard debris on November 18, 2023.

Pre-registration is **REQUIRED**, and **there is a \$30 fee**. Bulk waste needs to be bagged, boxed, or bundled. Bundles should not be bigger than 18 inches in diameter. Bulk waste must be cut to less than 4 feet. Bulk waste cannot exceed 75 lbs. Items that use gasoline, oil, or freon must have the fluids removed and tagged by a specialist. E-waste will be accepted. Items to be picked up must be placed on the curb on Friday evening. Online applications will start October 3 and will be available online via <https://www.centervilleutah.gov/313/Fall-Cleanup>.

Overnight Winter Parking - Dec 1 - Mar 31,

No parking on the street from Dec 1 – Mar 31 between 12 Midnight through 6 AM for more than 1 hour. - City Code 14.06.010. The term "vehicle" includes, but not limited to cars, trucks, boats, motorhomes, or any type of trailer.

Plowing Culs-de-sac During Snow Storms

Culs-de-sac, knuckles and dead-end neighborhoods will be plowed after 4 inches of snow have fallen.

Christmas Tree pickup is Saturday, Jan 6. No tinsel, artificial trees, or ornaments, as these trees are recycled. They should be out at the curb by Friday night. Please uncover them if it has snowed so drivers can see them.

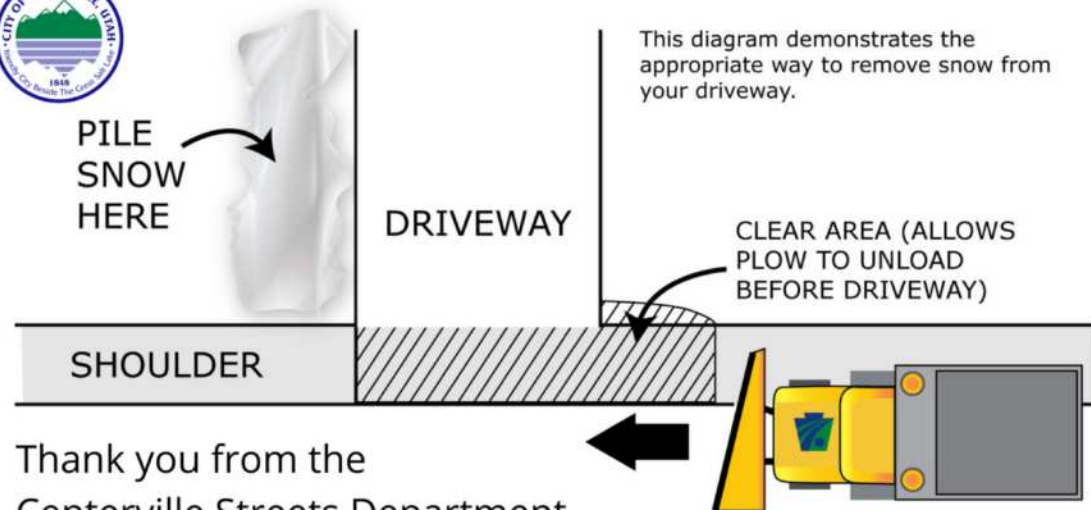
Park Restrooms Closed
