We recently held party primaries. While political parties can play a role in our city's elections, I am thankful that our city positions are nonpartisan. This allows everyone to share ideas openly, benefiting the entire community rather than just one group.

A neighbor just returned from Japan and told me how powerful their visit to the Hiroshima museum was. I had a similar feeling when I visited German concentration camps. We are very fortunate, since our challenges are small compared to what people faced back then. At Council meetings, I invite everyone to stand and recite the Pledge of Allegiance: "I pledge allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America, and to the Republic for which it stands, one Nation under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all." This pledge truly reflects my beliefs.

As we celebrate the 250th anniversary of the Declaration of Independence this July 4th, and see our Main Street lined with American flags, let's remember that this is the same flag Francis Scott Key saw, still flying, over Fort McHenry in Baltimore after a night of bombing, when the British retreated on September 14, 1814, during the War of 1812. That moment inspired him to write the Star-Spangled Banner.

This is the flag Colonel Theodore Roosevelt and his 'Rough Riders' raised on San Juan Hill after their victory over Spanish forces. It is also the flag honored by the large bronze statue near Washington, D.C., showing six U.S. Marines raising it on Mount Suribachi during the Battle of Iwo Jima on February 23, 1945.

This is the flag Neil Armstrong placed on the moon when he said, "One small step for man, one giant leap for mankind." It is also the flag shown in the famous photo of firefighters raising it above the ruins after the World Trade Center collapsed, creating a symbol of bravery and unity in the days and months that followed. We also drape this flag over the caskets of our fallen service men and women to honor their ultimate sacrifice for everything this flag stands for.

As your Mayor, I will proudly fly this flag and stand for liberty and justice for everyone, not just a few. This is my sincere wish for all Americans and for everyone in Centerville.

I hope you will take a moment to reflect on these thoughts as we celebrate the 250th anniversary of the Declaration of Independence. Let's all stay safe during our celebrations. Now more than ever, may "God bless America (and Centerville)."

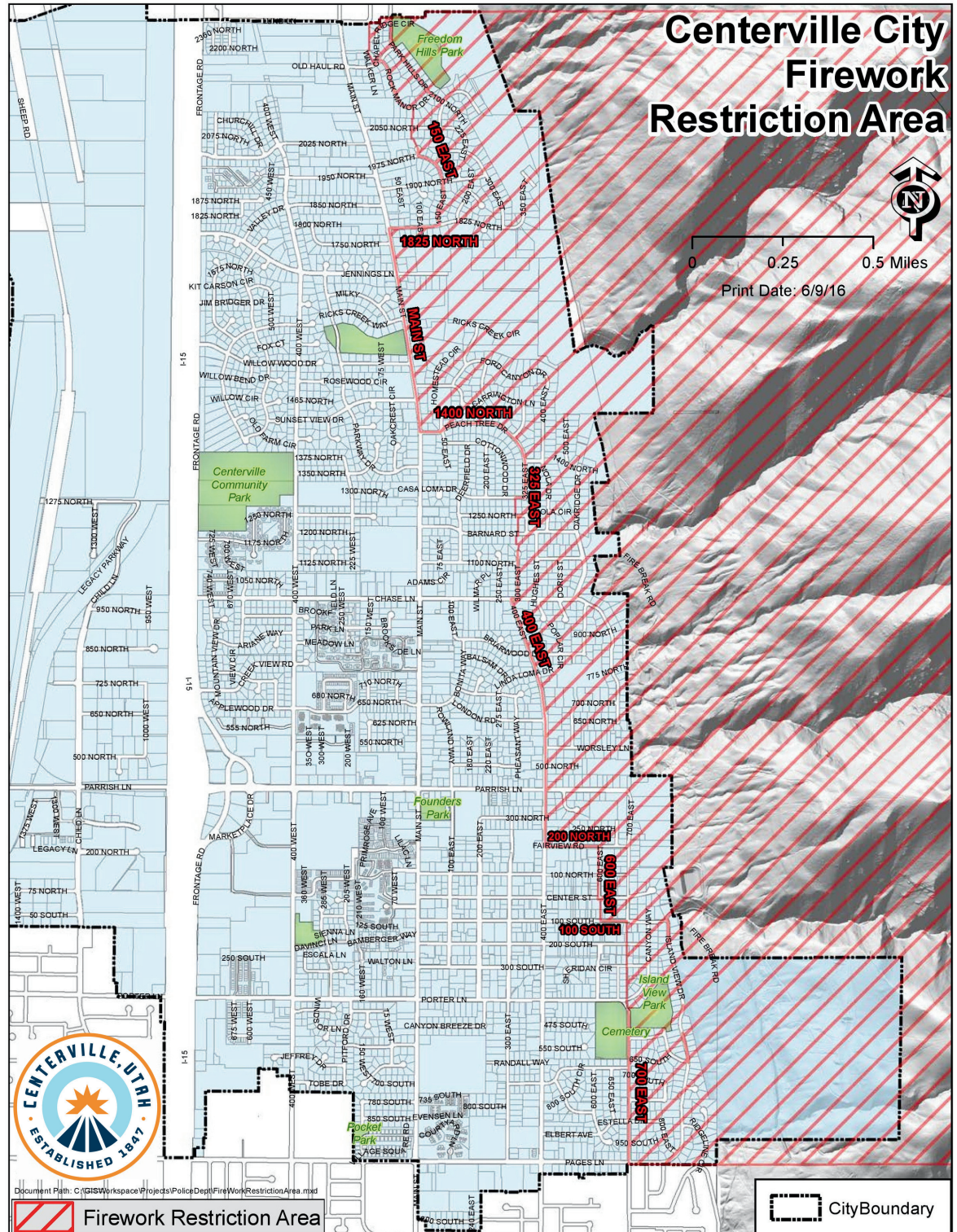

Firework Restrictions

This summer, the legal days for discharging legal fireworks are from July 2 to July 5, and from July 22 to July 25 from 11 AM to 11 PM. On July 4th and 24th, you may discharge fireworks until midnight. These limited days and hours for the discharge of fireworks is set by state law.

Due to the extreme danger of wild land fires, Centerville City has prohibited the discharge of fireworks on the east bench. The Fireworks Restriction Area Map (as seen here) shows this restricted area. You may only use fireworks that are legally sold at retail stores in Utah that are designed for consumer use; these are labeled as Class C Common or sometimes marked 1.4G. Any fireworks that have the designation Class C Dangerous Explosives are illegal.

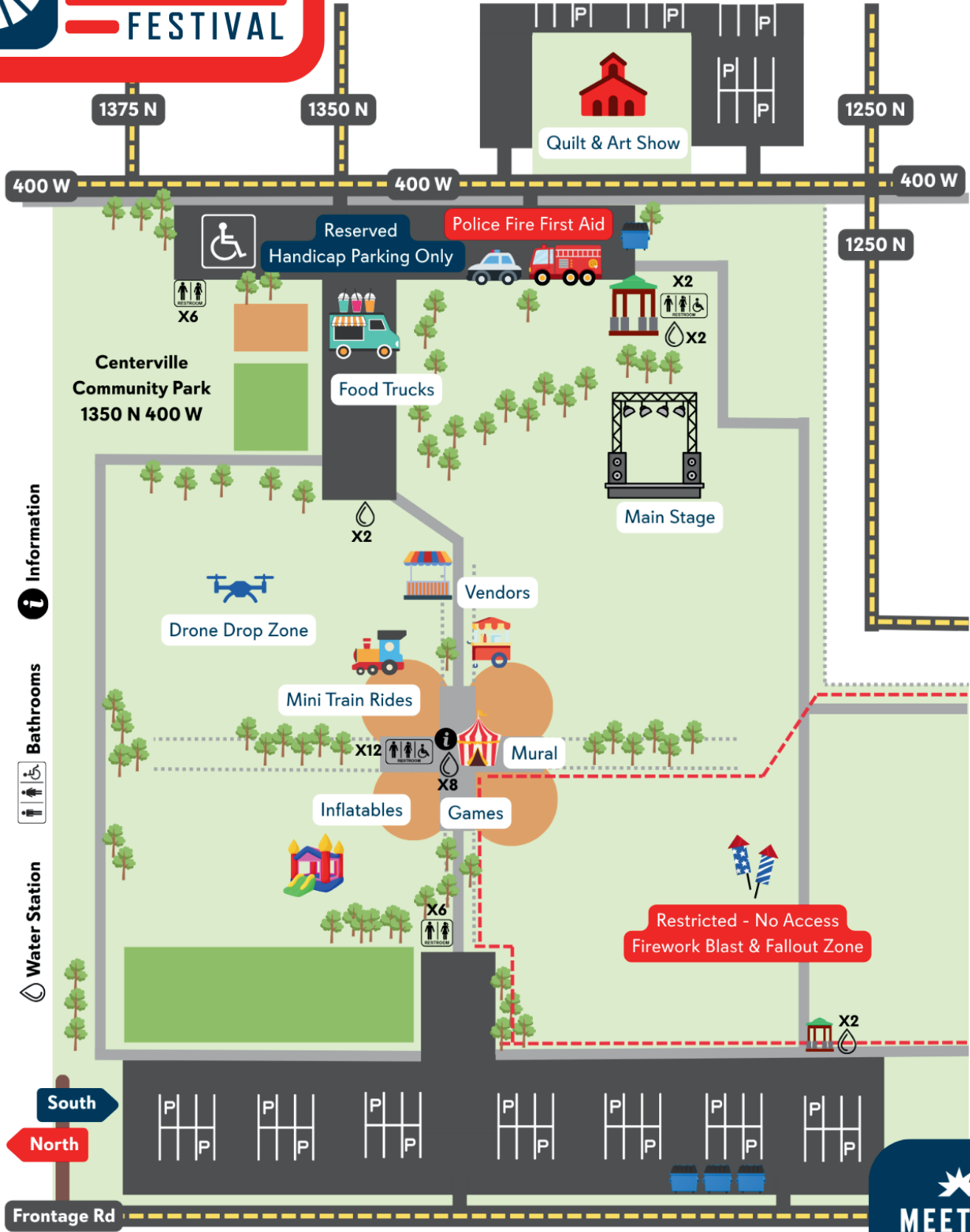
