Ladies and Gentlemen, piloting today's flyover are 4 Air Force Reserve pilots from Hill Air Force Base, Utah. These aviators are assigned to the 419th Fighter Wing, and Air Force Reserve unit made up of 1,200 "Citizen Airmen". The 149th routinely deploys in support of combat operations and humanitarian missions around the world.

Royall Airfare flyover 9:30ish

The Royall Air Force is a group of former military pilots that fly privately owned airplanes out of Morgan County Airport. The name Royall comes from our founding member, Mike Royall. We fly various versions of Vans Aircraft RV experimental aircraft. Our primary charter is to honor our veterans, current and past, by conducting patriotic formation overflights of veteran related national holidays and veteran funerals. All veteran overflights are done pro bono due to our admiration for those who have served our great Nation. Occasionally, we also fly for city parades and commercial events for the cost of fuel only. The Royall Air Force receives no compensation for any flying events, other than fuel reimbursement.

We have 7 members. Most of our overflights consist of 2-6 aircraft depending on pilot availability. For the Centerville July 4th Parade, we will have 5 participants. By formation position, they are:

On board, the highly trained crew is equipped with a full complement of firefighting gear, technical rescue tools, and yes the powerful Jaws of Life to aid in vehicle attractions. And it has a bell on the Front. South Davis Metro Fire is thrilled to place this cutting-edge engine into service, standing ready to protect the community for years to come!
